Clayton County District Attorney Tasha M. Mosley announces the conviction of Undre Turner. A Clayton County jury returned a guilty verdict on three counts of Armed Robbery, three counts of Possession of a Firearm During Commission of a Felony, and three counts of Aggravated Assault.

During the trial, the State presented evidence showing that in late March and early April of 2021, the defendant Undre Turner and a co – defendant scheduled "dates' with women staying in the College Park Hotel District. When the men arrived at the various hotels, they would wait for the victims to let Turner in the room and Turner would then usher the co-defendant in behind him. The victims were held at gunpoint while the men rifled through their purses, taking jewelry and other valuables. The investigation also revealed the men would make the victims send money via CashApp to the co-defendant during each robbery.

Assistant District Attorney Jocelyn Watkins led the State's case with Assistant District Attorney Maddie Zgonc serving as second chair. Major Case Investigator Khalil Rajahn and Victim Advocate Maria Dillard played vital roles in the prosecution of this case. The trial began on Tuesday March 26, 2024, and concluded Thursday March 28, 2024.

Clayton County Superior Court Chief Judge Robert L. Mack presided over the trial and sentenced the defendant to life plus 15 years.

District Attorney Mosley stated, "Those who choose to endanger the lives and well-being of others will be held accountable, As always, I commend my office on their tireless work to secure justice on behalf of all Clayton County citizens."
