Clayton County District Attorney Tasha M. Mosley announces the conviction of Kevin Green. A Clayton County Jury returned a guilty verdict on two counts of Voluntary Manslaughter, two counts of Aggravated Assault, and two counts of Possession of a Firearm during the Commission of a Felony.

During the trial, the State presented evidence showing the Defendant attended a sports café in Jonesboro with the victim Erickie Works and two others. After a night of drinking, Defendant Green and Mr. Works got into an altercation that continued after returning to a friend's home in Jonesboro. It was there that the Defendant shot and killed Mr. Works and then threatened the homeowner with the same firearm before leaving the scene. He was soon apprehended by law enforcement.

The State's case was presented by Deputy Chief Assistant District Attorney Jamal Williams and Assistant District Attorney Demarius Newsome. Investigator James Windon and Victim Advocate Nerissa Sims played crucial roles in the prosecution of the case. The trial began on January 27, 2025 and concluded on January 31, 2025.

Clayton County Superior Court Judge Shana Rooks Malone presided over the trial and has scheduled sentencing for a later date.

District Attorney Mosley stated, "The Clayton County District Attorney's Office remains committed to holding offenders accountable and ensuring justice for victims. We hope this conviction brings peace to the family of Mr. Works."
