Clayton County District Attorney Tasha M. Mosley announces the conviction of Arthur Brooks. A Clayton County jury returned a guilty verdict on all counts in the indictment: Homicide by Vehicle in the First Degree, Fleeing or Attempting to Elude a Police Officer, Reckless Driving, and Driving on Wrong Side of Roadway.

During the trial, the State presented evidence that the Defendant was sitting in his vehicle in the median of I-675. Officer Clevenger with the Clayton County Police Department attempted to make contact with the Defendant. Officer Clevenger's body worn camera showed the Defendant refuse to unlock his vehicle and put the vehicle in drive despite being instructed not to. The Defendant fled from Officer Clevenger and drove northbound in the southbound lanes. Shortly after fleeing, the Defendant hit the 27 year old victim, Torey Bundrage, head on and killed him upon impact.

Assistant District Attorney's Cecina Crabtree and Jamal Williams prosecuted the case on behalf of the State. Investigator James Windon and Victim Advocate Deja Stokes played vital roles in the prosecution of the case. The trial began on September 23, 2024, and concluded September 25, 2024, after the jury returned a guilty verdict on all counts in the indictment.

Clayton County Superior Court Judge Shana Rooks Malone presided over the trial. Sentencing is to be determined at a later date.

District Attorney Mosley stated, "While justice has taken its course, we know that healing from such a tragic event will take time and our thoughts remain with the victim's family and loved ones."
